Black and Indian Mission Collection: this weekend February 13th and 14th at all Masses our parish







My friends let us pray to accept the grace to 'empty our heads. That's right, empty our heads. Fast from filling your mind with performance driven ego-self oriented thoughts & plans of what you will do 'for God' during this Lenten Journey. Instead begin to purge our souls from the all-consuming fault finding inventory taking & stop the selfdefeating recriminating beatings. Start anew on this journey by making a sorrow filled confession, followed by a sincere Act of Contrition & your penance. The priest will help guide you. Ask God for the grace to see yourself as He sees you in this sorry state. You are His most precious creation, you are His son/daughter, you are His & He does Love you, absolutely & unconditionally. Accept the grace to believe this as fact & accept a grace filled faith to Love yourself as He does. Stop to realize that it is actually Divine grace which has led you to the painful suffering of conscience & the reluctance to admit to faults. Why would you resist? If you have been troubled by guilt for a long time, you probably have crowded your soul with negative self-talk & may have become accustomed to sensations of discomfort. Pain in the gut is often the result of unconscious or perhaps deliberate self- loathing. With stubborn folks it seems to be so habitual that they cannot escape the temptation to be so demoralized as to cause self-inflicted punishment for what is crowding & gnawing at their souls. They can come to feel so unworthy, so guilty that they believe lashing out & becoming angry, self-destructive & hopelessness is what they deserve. Being unloved – feeling unlovable is a shame with so much dreadful power. It is no wonder that on so many levels this is a very real root of addiction. How can you be a positive loving person or have an intimate relationship with God or anyone else if you do not experience nurturing Love? At a very tender age, so many are told they are unworthy, they are bad & they are no-good-for nothing. Eventually they come to believe severe abuse is deserved & Love does not exist. Too often, no one speaks to them of Love, there is no mention that God loves them &

certainly no one tells them that they are loved. Some are despondent to the point of bitter contempt. How do you cover the pain, the abandonment & the rejection? 9 times out of 10 a person finds the path of least resistance which is companionship with those like them - because - 'misery loves company or some live in isolation & despair, cutting ties - trusting no one & believing in nothing except suffering. It takes the grace of God to fill that void in their soul. God needs for us to share our grace with those in need. It's the God given grace alive in us which is meant to be shared. We who have already accepted the grace necessary must build relationships friendships & trust by being open, loving & accepting. God will do the rest. There is nothing more beautiful than seeing the mustard seed take root & begin to grow right before your eyes. It starts with our simple smile & our acknowledgement that the forlorn begin to change. They know they are not invisible to you, that they are loved & lovable & eventually they begin hearing that they are not invisible to God Almighty. The Light of God, in us, helps guide the needy come out of the darkness. Who are the needy? So often, all of us who sit in our pews week after week are searching for relief of our suffering souls yet remain invisible. How can we encourage anyone to accept the Love of God, if we remain hidden, stingy & unapproachable? All of this is to say on this 1st week of Lent – let us pray to step onto the path with the intention of deepening your personal relationships with God & others - asking for forgiveness & reconciliation. May we desire & ask for the grace to know that each of us is worthy of the Love of God & others. With confidence & steady footing may walk with the Love of God which fills the void in our soul. 'Look & see the Goodness of the Lord' within everyone who crosses your path, smile & recognize them as a child of God like yourself, needy & frail without truly knowing the Love of the Father. Let us ask & accept the grace of Divine Mercy of God & to stay in this path with Him - as we pray together in the Garden. Amen.
